## NOT ACCESSIBLE (NA)

- No walkers.
- Active participation required.
- Medium to long walks over uneven surfaces and stairs.

## PARTIALLY ACCESSIBLE (PA)

- Medium walks over uneven surfaces and stairs.
- Activities/space restrictions may preclude accessibility of walkers.

## ACCESSIBLE (A)

- walkers welcome
- light activity with short walks
- relatively level terrain.

## **BURNABY VILLAGE MUSEUM**

Go back in time and enjoy the simpler life. Ride the Parker Carousel built in 1912, for a taste of nostalgia. The village is a 10-acre open-air museum with 38 exhibits to explore, including period-specific homes, businesses, and a traditional schoolhouse. The village at Deer Lake may look like an authentic tram-stop community from the 1920s, but it is actually a faithful recreation.
